



Flying to EAA AirVenture? It's easy landing @ GRB
Plus, international flights clear for free

More than 450 planes expected @ GRB during AirVenture

(GREEN BAY, WI) The EAA is gearing up for another big [AirVenture](#) – and that means it will also be busy at [Green Bay's Austin Straubel International Airport](#) (GRB). EAA's annual AirVenture, which takes place July 23-29, 2018, is the world's largest fly-in gathering, and one of the world's largest aviation events. Attendance averages 500,000 and a significant number of those attendees fly to the event in their own planes. Wittman Field in Oshkosh quickly reaches capacity, so those pilots and attendees look for other places to land and park. Many come to GRB.

“We’ll easily see as many as 450 aircraft fly into GRB during the course of AirVenture because of the easy access in and out of our airport, as well as the abundance of available aircraft parking,” explains Marty Piette, Director of Green Bay Austin Straubel International Airport. “Another big advantage for those coming from outside the U.S. is that they can clear U.S. Customs for free at GRB. With our International Arrivals Terminal, they simply clear Customs at the International Arrivals Terminal and then park at one of the two Fixed Base Operators (FBO) ramps. It really is as simple as that.”

Both [Executive Air](#) and [Jet Air](#), the FBOs located at GRB, provide a full array of services for the pilots and attendees. “They offer fuel and repairs, can arrange for catering, hotel rooms, ground transportation and pretty much take care of whatever might come up during the course of AirVenture,” added Piette. “It’s very convenient.” Piette expects to see the first planes arrive at GRB the week before AirVenture, with the peak occurring on the first few days of the event.
