Amtrak and states celebrate *Borealis* reaching a quarter-million riders – and beyond

Milestone passed during the July 4 holiday weekend

CHICAGO and ST. PAUL, Minn. – Amtrak carried its 250,000th guest on state-sponsored *Borealis* trains between the Twin Cities and Chicago over the Independence Day 2025 holiday weekend.

"Thanks to the support of our partners, we're honored to have more than a quarter-million customers, and counting, travel on the *Borealis* train this past year," said <u>Amtrak President</u> <u>Roger Harris.</u> "Some of these guests have never before used Amtrak. Now all of them can enjoy the benefits of train travel while avoiding the long drive on Interstate 94."

Operated daily by Amtrak under contracts with the Minnesota, Wisconsin and Illinois state transportation departments, guests and officials have been celebrating a comfortable and reliable service that has routinely exceeded expectations since the <u>daily service began on May</u> 23, 2024.

"A quarter of a million riders demonstrate the desire for safe, equitable and reliable transportation options in Minnesota," said Minnesota Transportation Commissioner <u>Nancy</u> <u>Daubenberger</u>. "We remain pleased and encouraged by the early success of the *Borealis* and look forward to its continued growth."

"The *Borealis* continues to be a success story in Wisconsin and our partner states," said Wisconsin Transportation Secretary <u>Kristina Boardman.</u> "This 250,000-rider milestone clearly demonstrates the need for safe, reliable and efficient passenger rail travel options.
